Redford Cottage residents – Due to unforeseen circumstances, we have not received the new rental rates for 2023. Until we receive notification from MSHDA/HUD, please continue to pay the 2022 rental rate for your unit. We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience this delay may cause.

There has been an unusually increased amount of "after hour's calls for fire/smoke alarms. Your smoke detectors are extremely sensitive and require your undivided attention. Please stay in or near the kitchen when preparing or warming foods. Use the vent to eliminate excess steam. Make sure the surface of the stove is clean and there is no food or grease residue on or near the burners. Please allow our maintenance team time to travel from their homes to return to campus to disarm the alarms. Residents with multiple calls for smoke alarms will be billed the cost of overtime.

Please remind your guests, care-givers and family members that they must dial your apartment and not the office for entry into the building. It is not the responsibility of staff to allow visitors in to see you. Visitors must also sign "in" and "out" of the guest book.

Lease/House Rule reminder – Overnight guests are allowed to stay for a maximum of 21 days per year. If there is someone staying with you for more than the allowed number of days, you are in violation of your lease and risk non-renewal of your lease. There are provisions for live-in care-givers. However, there is strict protocol for the application process and acceptance of this request. Please call the office if you have questions.
