Where did the year go? The Holiday Season is upon us and there are still gifts to buy, greeting cards to send and preparation for festive meals with family and friends.



December is a Waiting Time

When we think December, we often think Christmas, Decorations are going up, presents are being bought, every club-has a Christmas party, families are planning to get together, and we are exhausted!

But this December is a time of heightened violence: Israelis versus Hamas (did you know, a large number of Palestinians are Christians?), Vhrainians versus Russians, Eritreans versus Ethiopians, and even groups in our own country so insistent on their own version of truth that they can become violent toward those who don't agree with them.

All this makes December so important as a time for waiting, for preparing, not just our surroundings, but our lives, our hearts. Actively waiting for peace by being peaceful, by not returning insult with insult, but by letting go even of the hard ones and being thankful for the good around us: for warmth, for food, for beds and medicine and friends. Those of us who are Christian are waiting for the coming of Jesus, not just 2000 years ago, but today, on December 25, and at the end of time. We call it "Advent".

Maintenance Musings

RE: What is a valid call to the Emergency maintenance line

No heat in the winter

No A/C in the summer

No electricity

Water that's running that can't be contained

There should be no calls for non emergency maintenance for:

Plugged up toilets, you should have a plunger

Any type of lightbulbs that have burned out.

These are just a couple of examples that can be called in during regular hours

RE: Do Not Use Stove As A Source Of Heat

In a best-case scenario, using your oven for supplemental or emergency heating is very inefficient, and at worst highly dangerous. Ovens are just not designed for heating a space over time.

If the electric oven is left on, and the door is left open for too long, the heat from the resistors will build up and may damage the wiring or other electrical components in the oven.

This can cause the oven knobs and temperature dials to melt and catch fire.

Repairs can be costly! A cost which will be passed on to you

Please do not leave pots unattended while cooking and remember to turn on the exhaust fan to prevent excessive steam setting off the smoke alarm
