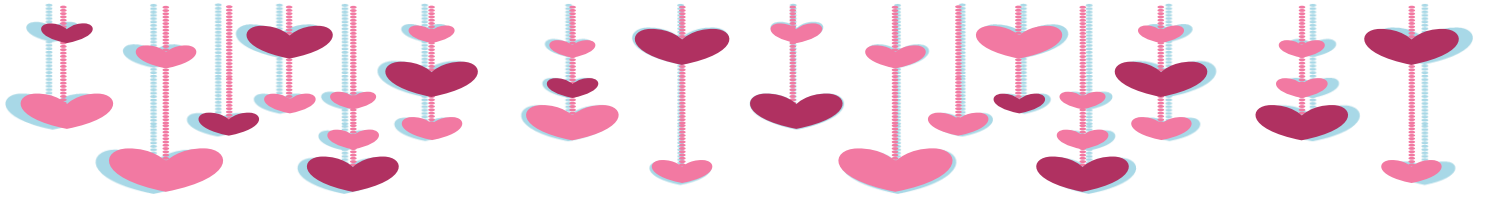

MAINTENANCE MUSINGS

Reminder:

- An independent resident should own a toilet plunger.  Independent residents are expected to attempt to unplug their toilet before reporting to the office that maintenance is needed to unclog their toilet. While you aren't required to have a sink plunger, we do recommend a sink plunger. Also it is important to inspect the jets around the underside rim of the toilet, as clogged jets can reduce flow and eventually clog the drain, and a thorough cleaning is an independent resident's responsibility.
- Thermostat diagrams (incl.: instructions-available in the office for residents). Other items not supplied by the Village of Redford:
 - Washing Machines
 - Dryers
 - Storm Doors
 - Light bulbs, (exception: Florescent tubular light bulbs)

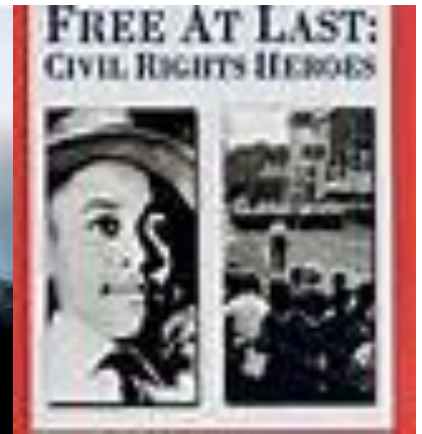
COTTAGES:

- The kitchen undersink cabinet doors should be left open when the weather is 10 degrees or less outside. If the cabinet doors are shut, the heat from your furnace can't reach the pipes, and you can end up with frozen faucets or even frozen drains! Occasionally this causes even more problems when pipes burst.
