Greetings OSM,



Early voting will be available beginning with the presidential primary in 2024 and every statewide and federal election thereafter.

Early voting allows a voter to cast a ballot before Election Day, in an experience similar to voting on Election Day.

Both early in-person voting and absentee voting allow voters to cast a ballot prior to Election Day. However, there are key differences between the two methods of voting.

Early voting allows voters to cast a ballot similar to how they would do so at a polling place on Election Day. Voters are issued a ballot and can personally insert it into the tabulator at their early voting site.

Absentee voting allows voters to request a ballot by mail or in person at their local clerk's office. Voters can complete their absentee ballot at home or at their local clerk's office and submit it in an envelope by mail, in person, or by drop box. After an absentee ballot is received by the local clerk, the voter's absentee ballot is processed and tabulated by their local clerk.

A voter must submit an absentee ballot application before an absentee ballot can be sent. Voters can request an absentee ballot up to 75 days before an election by submitting a completed application to their local clerk. Absentee ballots are available and distributed beginning 40 days before the election. Michigan voters can decide to be placed on a *permanent absentee ballot* list.

February is Wise Health Consumer Month!

This national health observance was established by the American Institute for Preventive Medicine to empower people to understand their options, communicate with care providers and make the most educated decisions possible about their health.

There are many ways you can become a wise healthcare consumer. Here are a few tips to follow.

- Take it slow when choosing a doctor.
- Prepare for doctor visits well ahead of time by jotting down your concerns and questions.
- Get regular physical exams.
- Be a partner with your doctor and participate in your care.
- Address symptoms early on.
- Know your medication, what it's for and what it does.
- Ask questions about your prognosis or treatment protocol.
- Caring for your mental health is just as important as your physical health.

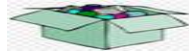

Mike's Maintenance Tips

Just a few reminders about the snow removal from the parking areas will be as follows:



- A. Residents **MUST** remove the snow from their vehicles and move their vehicles as directed by maintenance. This will allow the contractor ample space to maneuver equipment and efficiently clear away snow and spread salt. Those vehicles parked in the open area need to be moved to visitor parking, and back carport area by **8:00 a.m.** If the resident is unable to move his/her vehicle for **MAJOR** health reasons, he/she must make prior arrangements with someone to move his/her vehicle as required.
- B. If a resident plans to be away from the property overnight or for a vacation and will be leaving his/her vehicle parked in front of their building, he/she must notify the office with the name and telephone number of the person who will be responsible in his/her absence in case of an emergency.
- C. Inoperable vehicles are not allowed on the property. If they are not removed, they will be towed at the car owner's expense.
- D. A Container of salt will be provided at the front entrance. This container is for resident use when they notice slippery spot on the sidewalk or at the entrance. This is for **SAFETY REASONS ONLY!!!** This salt is not to be used for any other reason than stated above. (Please notify the office when salt pails are less than ½ full).
- E. Residents need to take extra precautions during cold, icy, and wet weather. Please dress warmly and wear rubber-bottomed boots or shoes that grip the ground better. Remember to always report "black ice", water puddles, or other slippery spots.

A Few Reminders:

- ***Please call the office with all work orders.***
- ***Please return grocery carts to the cart room after each use!***
- ***Please make sure the dryer lint cleaner is being emptied after each use.***
- ***If an Out of Order sign is posted on any of the machines, please do not use them.***
- ***No Candles, Small Candles for oils, or Incense is to be burned in the apartments or building. If you have to use a match or a lighter it is NOT allowed.***

INGREDIENTS

- 2 MEDIUM POTATOES, BAKED AND COOLED
- 1 CAN (14-1/2 OUNCES) CHICKEN BROTH
- 2 TABLESPOONS SOUR CREAM
- 1/8 TEASPOON PEPPER
- 1/4 CUP SHREDDED CHEDDAR CHEESE
- 1 TABLESPOON CRUMBLIED COOKED BACON OR BACON BITS
- 1 GREEN ONION, SLICED

INSTRUCTIONS

1. PEEL POTATOES AND CUT INTO ½ INCH CUBES.
2. PLACE HALF OF POTATOES IN BLENDER.
3. ADD BROTH, COVER AND PROCESS UNTIL SMOOTH
4. POUR INTO SAUCEPAN
5. STIR IN SOUR CREAM, PEPPER, AND REMAINING POTATOES.
6. COVER OVER LOW HEAT UNTIL HEATED THROUGH (DO NOT BOIL)
7. GARNISH WITH CHEESE, BACON, AND ONION.

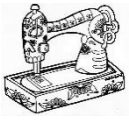
