The Washington Post reported recently that some 17% of people living in the United States, or more than one in six, were 65 or older in 2020, according to a report from the Administration on Aging. That percentage represents 55.7 million people, an increase of 15.2 million, or 38% of people 65 and above, since 2010, compared with just 2% growth in the under 65 population. The figure also reflects a consistent increase in the nation's older population since 1900, when there were 3.1 million Americans 65 and older, or 4% of the population.







