Summer is known for its sporadic weather patterns and that includes thunderstorms and power outages. In case of severe weather warnings, residents of the Villa are asked to seek shelter in the first floor hallways, away from windows. Signage is placed along the hallways for further directions. If you use supplemental oxygen that is powered by electricity, you should plan for a loss of power.

It is wise to have an oxygen tank supply (and know how to use it) in case you need to switch to a delivery system that does not require electricity. It also helps to have a support team that you can call in case of emergency.

To eliminate the risk of fire, please do not burn Tikki torches (or any form of open flame) on the lawns. Bar-B-Q pits should be placed at least 10 feet from the building. A fire extinguisher or bucket of sand or water should be kept near the grill. A cell phone or PHB should be on hand in case of emergency.

Please see that you are adhering to garbage collection rules. Cottage residentsmake sure your garbage is set out at the appointed times. Villa residents, please tightly secure all garbage being thrown down the trash chute. The warm weather brings unwanted pests to the trash room and surrounding areas.

If you have a Good Fellow doll that you have dressed, please return them to the office by Friday August 18, 2023. Dolls should be returned in the original plastic wrapping.

Redford Village has a "no smoking" policy. That policy includes E-Cigarettes (commonly known as vaping) as well as tobacco cigarettes. Smoking is not allowed in any area of the building, including apartments, patios, balconies and the front porch.






