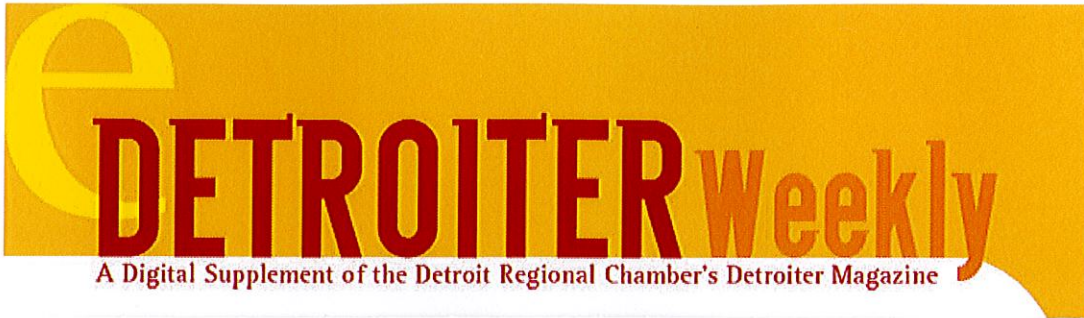

## New collaboration leads to community development in Detroit



Three nonprofit organizations with a history of innovation and service in Michigan today announce they have formed a first-of-its-kind collaboration to redevelop a neighborhood, create jobs and fill important health care and living needs for seniors in the City of Detroit.

Henry Ford Health System (HFHS), Presbyterian Villages of Michigan (PVM) and United Methodist Retirement Communities (UMRC) plan to break ground in May 2011 on Phase I of the East Jefferson Neighborhood Project, which is scheduled to open in July 2012.

The East Jefferson Neighborhood Project was awarded a \$2 million grant from the Community Foundation for Southeast Michigan. The grant spans two years for the development of the East Jefferson Neighborhood Project, in cooperation with the three partners. The funding was made possible through the Detroit Neighborhood Fund.
