I hope that you're all enjoying the weather – it looks like a beautiful Independence Day weekend! Enjoy the beauty of Bay City's fireworks – they are amazing!

On July 7th (Thursday) at 2:00 p.m., we will have a presentation entitled “Spot A Stroke – FAST (Face, Arm, Speech, Time)” by The Care Team. Please come and learn about the signs of a stroke – none of us know when we might be with someone who has one, or experience one – it is always good to have prior knowledge of what it looks like.

On July 13th (Wednesday) at 2:00 p.m., we will have a presentation: “Myths & Facts: Substance Abuse and Prescription Drugs” by Mel from Southern Care. This is a presentation subject that has been requested by several residents and will be good information for those who have others coming in and out of their apartment who might have access to your medications as well as make you aware of the signs of substance abuse when it comes to prescribed medications.

We will have Blood Pressure Clinics on July 14th at 2:30 p.m. and again on July 28th at 2:00 p.m. – please come and take advantage of having your blood pressure checked by a trained professional. It is a good preventative measure, and should be monitored on a regular basis.

For those of you who have come to me with questions concerning Medicare and Medicaid and Healthcare Marketplace insurances, I will be training on them the end of July. Due to this training, I will be out of the office from July 22 – August 1. This is my advance warning, so contact me if you need assistance prior to the 22nd, otherwise I will see you and be happy to meet when I return.



Remember, I am on “Summer Hours”. I am in my office Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 1:30 – 6:30 p.m. **Because of the Independence Day Holiday, I will have adjusted hours:** on Tuesday and Wednesday I will be here 1:30 – 6:30 p.m. and on Thursday I will be here 1:30 – 5:30 p.m. Friday I will be off as is my usual Summer schedule.

And remember, due to the training on Medicare and Medicaid, I will not be here July 22 – August 1. **You can always call (989) 892-6906 and request an appointment at any time** – if I'm not here, leave a message and I will return your call as soon as I return. You can also leave me a message in the lockbox outside my office door.

On a related note – Remember that I am here to assist you to “Age in Place” or as someone recently called it – “THRIVE in Place” (stay in your home - happily) as long as you desire and can safely remain. Come talk with me if you're having difficulty with the things you need to do and we'll see how I can help!

Answers to the Trivia Quiz:

- 1 **C.** But it would not be correct to say it's the day the Continental Congress voted for independence. That actually happened July 2, but wording of the declaration was approved two days later.
2. **D.** The hard winter at Valley Forge was 1777-78. The other three happened in 1775, with Washington taking command of the Continental Army a year and a day before the declaration was signed.
3. **B.** The Chinese invented fireworks and were the first to use them to celebrate things.
4. **D.** The Continental Congress was meeting in Philadelphia. Boston and New York would have been too dangerous and Washington, D.C. didn't exist.
5. **A.** "We the people of the United States" is the beginning of the Constitution.
6. **C.** Jones reportedly said this while commanding the USS Bonhomme Richard in the battle with HMS Serapis. His ship sank but not before the Serapis was captured.
- 7.**C.** King George III, who was king for some 60 years, although during the last 10 he was suffering from a mental illness and his son was the actual ruler.
8. **D.** The declaration says nothing about disarming colonists, although it wasn't uncommon for British troops to seize guns and ammunition from them in attempts to put down "the rebellion."
9. **D.** New Mexico wasn't a British colony.
10. **A.** Vicksburg did not celebrate the Fourth of July for 81 years because on that day in 1863 the Confederate forces defending the city surrendered to Gen. Ulysses Grant after a long siege.
11. **B.** The Hessian troops were from what is now Germany.
12. **C.** Aaron Burr was the third vice president. But Jefferson and Burr didn't get along and he was dropped when Jefferson ran for his second term in 1804, the year Burr Alexander Hamilton in a duel.
13. **C.** 12 colonies voted for independence on July 2 and for the wording on July 4, but the New York delegation had to abstain because they didn't have the authority from their provincial congress to vote. That authority arrived about a week later and the congress passed a resolution so the final copy of the declaration was amended to say it was the unanimous declaration of the 13 states.


Conversations in the lobby can be disruptive, loud and uninviting.

Tuna and White Bean Salad



Ingredients

- ½ cup olive oil
- 2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- ¾ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon black pepper
- 1 large cucumber, peeled, seeds removed, chopped
- 4 plum tomatoes, chopped
- ½ cup chopped red onion
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
- 1 (15.5-ounce) can great northern beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 (12-ounce) can solid white tuna, drained well

Directions

- In a large bowl, whisk together olive oil, lemon juice, Italian seasoning, salt, and black pepper
- Stir in cucumber, tomato, onion, parsley and beans. Add tuna and toss gently until evenly coated. Serve immediately or refrigerate until ready to serve.


