

Sugar Cream Pie

1 pie crust
 4 tbsp. cornstarch
 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ c sugar
 4 tbsp. melted butter
 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ c heavy cream
 For Topping:
 4 tbsp. melted butter
 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ c cinnamon sugar mix
 Mix ingredients and pour in pie pan
 over pie crust

Bake at 325 approx. 25 min then
 Broil for 1 min

To caramelize the topping.
 After baking allow pie to cool then
 chill one hour before serving

Snow Removal Policy

1. Snow removal from roads and walkways should be completed by 7:00 a.m. on snow days when there is a 2-inch or more accumulation. There MAY be a delay in this schedule on weekends and holidays.
2. Snow removal from the parking areas will be as follows:
 - A. Residents **MUST** remove the snow from their vehicles and move their vehicles as directed by maintenance. Residents in Woodland Manor need to park their vehicles on the West Side of the building when there are reports of snow fall. This will allow the contractor ample space to maneuver equipment and efficiently clear away snow and spread salt.

All vehicles need to be moved to an area that has been cleaned out by **11:00 a.m.**

If the resident is unable to move his/her vehicle for MAJOR health reasons, he/she must make prior arrangements with someone to move his/her vehicle as required.

Maintenance is not responsible for removing snow from resident vehicles or for moving resident vehicles to another location during snow removal.
 - B. If a resident plans to be away from the property overnight or for a vacation and will be leaving his/her vehicle parked in front of their building, he/she must notify the office with the name and telephone number of the person who will be responsible in his/her absence in case of an emergency.
 - C. If after snow removal has been completed your parking area is still icy, please let management know. We can order additional salting for your safety.
 - D. Inoperable vehicles are not allowed on the property. If they are not removed, they will be towed at the car owner's expense.
3. Containers of salt will be provided at the entrances of ALL buildings. These containers are for resident use when they notice a slippery spot in the sidewalk or at the entrance. This is for **SAFETY REASONS ONLY!!!** This salt is not to be used on resident's private patios or for any other reasons than stated above. (Please notify the office when salt pails are less than ½ full).

Questions and concerns about snow removal should ALWAYS be brought to the attention of Management!

Resident safety is always a priority with Maintenance and Management. Residents need to take extra precautions during cold, icy, and wet weather. Please dress warmly and wear rubber-bottomed boots or shoes that grip the ground better. Remember to always report "black ice", water puddles, or other slippery spots. We cannot be everywhere at once, but with your help, conditions will be much safer for all!


