So along with October being one of the more colorful months in Michigan it is National Fire Safety month. So, I would like to discuss Fire safety.

We all know the main causes of an apartment fire but let me review.

COOKING – yes, nearly half of apartment fires are the result of being careless when cooking. Leaving something cooking in the oven or on the cooktop and essentially forgetting about it. Receiving a phone call from a loved one or falling asleep are a couple of things that distract us while cooking. So please focus when cooking to keep all safe.

SMOKING – As you know smoking is never allowed in your apartment and is a serious lease violation and yes, it is another major cause of apartment fires.

SPACE HEATERS – Again space heaters are not allowed and is a lease violation as well. We want to keep all residents safe!

NO SMOKE DETECTORS OR NON-WORKING SMOKE DETECTORS – This is critical to be aware of. THEY SAVE LIVES! I want to expand on this. During recent inspections, and yes, we have many inspections, some detectors were found to be removed from their proper place on the walls or ceiling. THIS IS A VIOLATION OF FEDERAL LAW and is a serious lease violation. Please understand we need to be diligent with this to protect the safety and wellbeing of all in our community.


