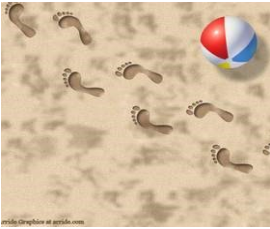

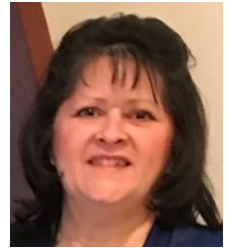

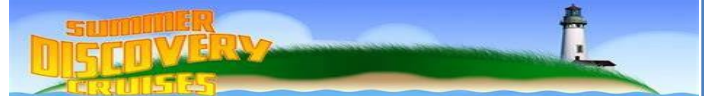

Residents Association Meeting May 8,2018

Meeting was called to order at 1:32 by President, Bob Morrill. 48 in attendance.

Residents attending a meeting for the first time were welcomed: Steve Turbin, Jean Ciamataro, and Joyce Walker;.

Chaplain Laura gave the invocation and Bob Healy led the pledges to the American and Christian flags.

Brian Williams, Food Service: The dining room will be open for the fashion show, but will not be turned over to the village until some wiring is done and an inspection passed. Village of East Harbor is participating in the Anchor Bay food competition which they won last year. Cameron Cafe is due to open the end of May. It will have a "Panera Bread" type menu; soups and salads and sandwiches. And a "pick up 'and go" menu. Some sundries will available as well. There will be an omelet station this month. In answer to a question, you will not be able to use your meal plan card in the restaurant.

Laura Stone, Chaplain Waffle Wednesdays be May 30. Waffles are socializing are free. Wednesday, May 16 is "Hope for the Hungry" and Lunch with veterans on May 22. Time for Bible Study has been changed to 1:30 from 3:00 at the request of residents

David Miller,Admiistrator address some questions from residents;

Irma Black and Linda Adderman asked about repair on the roof as there has been water leakage for 2 or 3 years. Mr. Miller indicated that this a plan for new roofing on that section of the building. He will look into immediate repairs. Questioned about the grease box in the parking lot Mr Miller said he will talk to the construction company about removing it.

Questioned about a library in the new building, Mr. Miller explained that there will not be a library room as part of the current renovation. Given the space available there was preference for a cafe rather than a library. Currently there will be shelves for books in the Cameron Cafe and other available space. Also tow computer terminals will be located in the Capman Dining room. As we go into plans for the next phase a library will be considered. We might want to look into some regularly scheduled trips to the Chesterfield Library.

Delay in opening the new dining room has to do with issues relating to the fire suppression system. Electronic ordering will be an option in the restaurant. You can charge to your account, pay cash or use a credit card.

The new nursing wing will open soon, the whole section will be completed by the end of July.

An additional \$50,000 was received this month toward the Health and Wellness Center.

This summer planning for Phase 2 will begin. There will be a sub-committee of residents involved in brainstorming ideas for the new apartments.

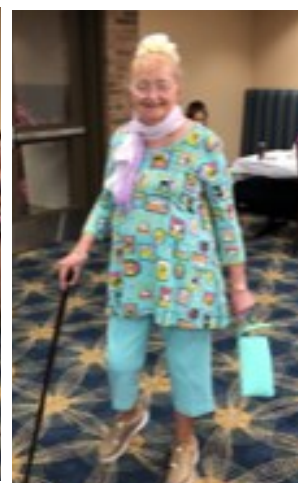
