Are you as anxious as we are to see the new construction begin? Plans are being finalized, and construction will be underway by this Fall! The plan is to construct a 3-story midrise building to house 60 apartments. These will be one and two bedroom units, between 700-950 square feet, independent with some services available. In addition, we plan to build 36 villas, similar to our cottage homes with 1 and 2 car attached garages. They will all be month-to-month rentals, and will have amenities such as a pond and fountain! Naturally, current residents get priority if they wish to relocate to the new building.

### PLANNED POWER OUTAGE—JUNE 11


