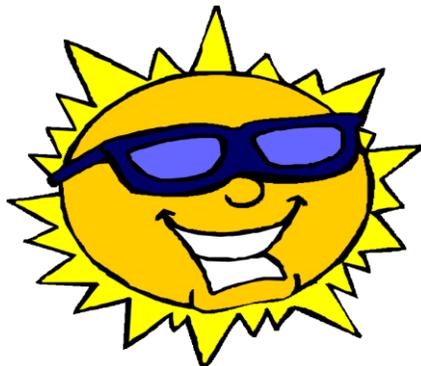
Stay Cool!

Picnics, fireworks, and Independence Day are the hallmarks of July. So too are heat and humidity. In July, mid-day temperatures in Michigan average in the mid 80's. Add to this an average humidity level of just over 72% and you have a potentially dangerous combination. Prolonged exposure to high heat and humidity can cause the body to lose its ability to cool itself, ultimately resulting in heat stroke, a serious medical condition that can cause permanent disability or death if prompt emergency treatment isn't provided.

To help protect against heat related illness, when it is hot and humid outside:

- Drink plenty of cool, non-alcoholic, non-caffeinated beverages.*
- Wear lightweight, light-colored clothing.
- Stay indoors during the hottest parts of the day (preferably in an air-conditioned environment).
- Avoid engaging in strenuous activities.
- Reduce the amount of meat you eat (since digesting meat raises body temperature and increases water loss).
- Limit direct sun exposure (which increases body temperature and can result in sunburn, which reduces the body's ability to dissipate heat).
- Take a cool shower, bath, or sponge bath.
- Rest often.

*If your doctor has limited your intake of fluids or has put you on water pills, you should first check with him or her before increasing your fluid intake.

Mayor's Message

Greetings OSM Residents,

The Westland Police Department has developed a new community policing initiative called the Westland Police Neighborhood Safety Program. Our Police Department recognizes that every neighborhood has different concerns and public safety needs. The goal of this program is to meet directly with the residents of specific neighborhoods to discuss their concerns. Working in partnership with neighborhood residents, the Westland Police Department will identify and resolve specific quality of life problems or concerns. In addition, this is a great opportunity for neighbors to meet each other while also meeting their City's police officers. The first Neighborhood safety meeting will take place on Saturday, June 5 at 10:00 a.m. in Rotary Park, located at 601 Hanlon, with a specific focus on the businesses and homes between Marquette/Cherry Hill and Wayne/Radcliff. Mayor Wild, Police Chief Jeff Jedrusik and Westland's Community Police Team will be in attendance. There will be regular meetings scheduled throughout the year in order to specifically focus on our Westland neighborhoods individually.

Westland will once again host its Park It "Outdoor Movie Night" Community Gathering on June 23 at Tattan Park. This free, family friendly event starts at 5:00 p.m. and features hot dogs, popcorn, information on community initiatives, and an outdoor showing of the movie "Onward" beginning at 7:00 p.m.

Later in the summer the City will also hold a "Public Safety" Community Gathering at Corrado Park on July 21. Residents in attendance can view police, fire and public service vehicles, enjoy inflatable attraction, meet and greet your local public service officials and also enjoy free food and refreshments.

The City's events team is currently working on planning its premier annual event, Blues, Brews and BBQ, which is slated to take place on August 6 and 7. As in years past, thousands will be treated to some of the Detroit Blues Society's most popular acts, amazing barbeque and a wide variety of Michigan's most popular micro-brews and back by popular demand, a firework celebration on Saturday evening. Proceeds from this event are donated back to area non-profits and community groups who volunteer to help plan, organize and operate the event. We have also added to our slate of summer events this year with a Smooth Summer Nights Concert Series, which will take place on August 19 and 26 from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at Tattan Park. These events will be the perfect complement to our All American Farmers and Artisans Marketplace which has officially kicked off for the season and takes place every Thursday from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

The City continues to prioritize its Mission:Green initiative and has recently announced a number of projects which further our goal of promoting green practices and sustainability in the community. Westland recently approved a contract with Greenspot to install, own and maintain four Level 2 Electric Vehicle Charging Stations on City-owned property for public use. They will engage DTE directly to install their own meter for electric usage at each site location and will be responsible for all costs. In addition to being a no-cost initiative for the City, Westland will also receive 5% of the annual revenues generated from this program which can be used to help offset other Citywide Mission:Green initiatives.

Strawberry Pretzel Dessert



INGREDIENTS

2 CUPS CRUSHED PRETZELS (ABOUT 8 OUNCES)
 3/4 CUP BUTTER, MELTED
 3 TABLESPOONS SUGAR

FILLING

2 CUPS WHIPPED TOPPING
 1 PACKAGE (8 OUNCES) CREAM CHEESE, SOFTENED
 1 CUP SUGAR

TOPPING

2 PACKAGES (3 OUNCES EACH) STRAWBERRY GELATIN
 2 CUPS BOILING WATER
 2 PACKAGES (16 OUNCES EACH) FROZEN SWEETENED SLICED STRAWBERRIES, THAWED
 OPTIONAL: ADDITIONAL WHIPPED TOPPING AND PRETZELS

INSTRUCTIONS

1. In A BOWL, COMBINE PRETZELS, BUTTER, AND SUGAR.
2. PRESS INTO UNGREASED 13X9-IN BAKING DISH.
3. BAKE AT 350° FOR 10 MINUTES
4. COOL ON WIRE RACK
5. FOR FILLING, IN A SMALL BOWL, BEAT WHIPPED TOPPING, CREAM CHEESE, AND SUGAR UNTIL SMOOTH.
6. SPREAD PRETZEL OVER CRUST
7. REFRIGERATE UNTIL CHILLED
8. FOR TOPPING, DISSOLVE GELATIN WITH BOILING WATER IN A LARGE BOWL
9. STIR IN SWEETENED STRAWBERRIES.
10. CHILL UNTIL PARTIALLY SET.
11. CAREFULLY SPOON OVER FILLING.
12. CUT INTO SQUARES AND SERVE WITH ADDITIONAL WHIPPED TOPPING AND PRETZELS.

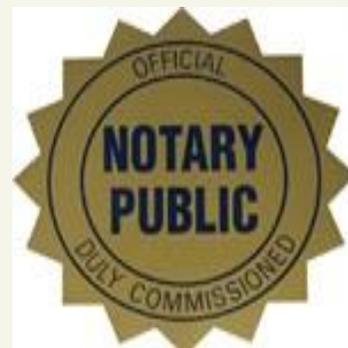

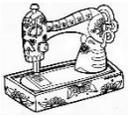
