This month at Oakland Woods will feature a variety of events to keep you active this summer!

Fitness class with Hillary will continue on a weekly basis through July and August on Fridays only at 10:30 with Strength class; starting on July 10th, we will begin our Healthy Steps Movement Class that will be held every Monday and Wednesday at 10:30 through mid-August.

This 6 week class will incorporate therapeutic movement, dance, and exercise to provide a fun and beneficial workout focused on improving overall mobility, balance, and energy levels while decreasing stiffness, swelling, and weakness. Healthy Steps Lebed Method is an internationally recognized program recommended for any and all fitness levels as the class can be done seated or standing and focuses on slow, controlled movement. We encourage you to try it out and enjoy a good time of healthy movement!

Our **Summer Tech Talk Sessions** will continue **every other Tuesday at 11am** with different topic focuses each session. For this month, our topics will include:

July 11th: Managing Email and Text Messaging – Composing, Sending, Deleting, Scams, etc.

Grocery items will vary and be available to registered residents on a first come first serve basis. Those who cannot get to the Community Center due to mobility issues can contact the office to request assistance.

This month, we will be starting a new monthly meeting format for residents called **Townhall Meeting**; our first meeting will take place **July 18th at 1pm**.

Various members of our staff will be present at this meeting to address questions from residents and provide updates. We will also have Beth, our PACE representative, provide information on the PACE program that helps seniors stay healthy by providing all-inclusive healthcare and a day program to keep seniors active. 
